

Treasurer's Report



I am pleased to be able to report that we have received the claim payout of \$50,000 from our insurance company for the funds that were stolen from the church. The recovery of these funds gives us some breathing room in our financial outlook.

Actual year-to-date net income (income after expenses) through the end of April was significantly higher than budget. Our original budget for the year was a loss of \$30,500 and thankfully we are no longer tracking to report a loss.




The next Council Meeting will be held on Monday, June 13th at 6:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall. All are welcome to attend.
