The next Council Meeting will be held on Monday, October 10th at 6:30 PM in the Fellowship Hall. All are welcome to attend.






Reformation Sunday

Your local TV stations have full lists on their websites. In addition, an escape plan if conditions call for it. Let family members know where you are and where you may be going, such as schools, community centers, hospitals or other types of shelters set up by your city or county.

Our church property continues to look very good and presentable to any potential members who like the appearance of our campus. I would like to send out a huge THANK YOU to our members who go above and beyond in keeping our property, both inside and out, looking spectacular, including those who have stepped up to the plate during my absence and took care of some necessary repairs and upgrades.
