# Message from the President


Christmas Angel Gifts are due back to church no later than Sunday, 12/17/23, and please make sure the angel is attached to your packages.

## Treasurers Report



After the significant expenses incurred over the past two months, our net income through the end of October was \$1,212. These expenses eroded the income we had made through the end of August; however, we did not have to dip into our reserves to cover them.

- On the positive side
  - -- Higher than expected weekly offering \$17,136
  - -- Recovery of stolen funds \$5,061
  - -- Interest income \$2,411
- ♦ On the negative side
  - -- Higher than budgeted insurance expense \$8,960
  - -- Fellowship Hall roof \$15,548
  - -- Flood cleanup expenses \$5,483

Once again, I would like to thank those members who made donations to help defray the cost of the new roof and flood cleanup. Your generosity is truly appreciated.

What a year it has been for Faith Lutheran! Let us reminisce what Faith Lutheran has accomplished in 2023:

- 1. Delivered Mylar blankets to the Salvation Army to help the homeless in the cold temperatures.
- 2. Our Plarning group provides mats for the homeless. The mats are blessed in a church service before sharing with the community. Members of the Plarning group are: Barbara Neunfeldt, Marge Sykes, Elisa Amaro(mother of Nancy Sykes), Marge Cullen, Carol Webster, Ceil Masterson and Bat Masterson (Bat makes the best Plarn balls for the team). I also want to thank the people who make anonymous plarning balls for this ministry.
- 3. Spring Food Drive, Easter Dinner for four.
- 4. Birthday Cake Boxes for those in need provided to the Salvation Army Pantry.
- 5. Food donations to the Salvation Army Pantry. Thank you all for the food donations to the grocery basket. To date, 925 lbs. of food have been donated. And we still have six more weeks to make 1,000 lbs. for the year. **We can do it!**
- Donations of 'gently used' clothes and blankets for the homeless community. Clothes are used for job interviews.
- 7. Pizza Day for the Boy Scouts of America affiliated with Faith Lutheran Church, thanking them for all of the tasks completed at Faith Lutheran Church.
- 8. Backpacks to include school supplies for the foster children in our area.

- 9. "God's Work Our Hands": Provided lunch for Ormond Beach police officers, blessing (thank-you) bags for the local police, and Teddy Bears for the officers to give out to children in need.
- 10. Stewardship: Stewardship is a practice of generosity that involves using all that God has entrusted to our care – our time, our talents, and our treasures – to love God and our neighbors, both inside and outside of the church walls and our homes.
- 11. Basket Brigade: This year 85 boxes of food were donated to provide Thanksgiving meals for families in Volusia County.
- 12. Angel Tree: Faith Lutheran will provide presents to foster children of families, Community Partnership for Children in Volusia, Flagler and Putnam counties. As winter is upon us, can we provide another set of Mylar blankets to the Salvation Army to help the homeless in the cold temperatures?
