Grace, Peace and Love:

On Ash Wednesday, February 14, the church entered the Liturgical Season of Lent. Ash Wednesday begins a forty-day journey of prayer and repentance that concludes on Holy Saturday, March 30, 2024. It prepares believers for the celebration of Easter. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We die to sin and evil and continue our life in God's will.

The Lenten tradition calls us to practice self-discipline throughout the season. During Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to seeking the Lord in prayer and scripture. Lent is to be a time of repentance. These forty days are set aside to praise and worship the Lord.

Lent signifies a solemn forty-day period preceding preparation for the celebration of Easter. Between Ash Wednesday and Easter our spirit focuses on redemption. It is the redemption of all that acknowledge the faith that Jesus was sent to impart to humanity. The Christian meaning of Lent revolves around preparation, reflection, and penance as we reflect on the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. Sin has separated us from God. The story of Lent tells of what Jesus had to endure to save believers from sin, death, and evil. Lent is an opportunity to contemplate what our Lord really did for us on the cross.

In an ever-changing world of uncertainty, reliability brings comfort. The challenge for the believer in the 21st Century world we live in is to recognize the change that's before us and discover divine presence in the change. The spirit of Lent in these uncertain times brings certainty to the journey given to travel. As our situations change from year to year, the Season of Lent provides spiritual guidance through uncertain changing times.

The Lenten spirit helps the faithful to embrace the uncertainty. We discover new truths amid the change and uncertainty of our lives. It is my prayer that this Lenten season will be a blessed one for you, even amid your uncertainties.

We are off to a good start for the year with net income (income less expenses) of \$23,218 for the month of January. Please note that some members elect to make annual contributions and January reflects those total-year offerings.

A financial audit was completed on January 31st with no issues noted. Thank you to Jerry Mikulski, Rich Eames, and Charlie Hoyle for volunteering their time to conduct this important review. Thank you also to Yvonne Magill for keeping our records and reports organized and accurate. That certainly makes the audit process go smoothly.

As you know, our insurance costs skyrocketed last year and so one of the first items for this year was to look for any opportunity to lower our premiums. Not surprisingly, our agent at Brown and Brown informed us that Property Insurance rates have increased yet again and we will not be able to get a better rate at this time. We will revisit this in June, but I am not very optimistic that a decrease will happen. The way the insurance market is now, we could very well see another increase. We will just have to wait and see.
