Grace, Peace and Love:

On May 19th, 'Pentecost Sunday', we will enter the Liturgical Season of Pentecost. For now, the celebration of the 'Easter Resurrection' will continue with us for the next few weeks. The resurrection is about God's sacrifice of Jesus, his son and the 'believer's resurrection benefit' from this gracious act of forgiving salvation.

In three days, Jesus resurrected from death. The 'believer's resurrection' occurs over the span of a lifetime. Jesus's resurrection extends through eternity; the believer's resurrection also extends to and through eternity. It is an eternity that awaits those who are worthy to receive the blessed promise of eternal life. Jesus's resurrection reveals to humanity that sin, death, evil, fear and division were all conquered in his Easter Resurrection. For 'believers', sin, death, evil, fear and division have also been conquered by resurrecting the committed faithful to the life that Jesus died for so that humanity would know, accept or reject the life

Jesus came to convey and describe. The point being: "The resurrection of Jesus and the resurrection of the faithful is life beyond life.

Our Easter experience will soon give way to Pentecost's spiritual reality. Easter defines the nature of God's plan for believer's Pentecost spiritual redemption. Pentecost brings us real life experiences that grow the spirit, incrementally growing the resurrected spirit within.

The scriptural story of salvation is our guide to understanding, as best we can, the will of God. Romans 8:28 says it this way: "We know that in everything God works for good with those who love him, who are called according to his purpose". His purpose is what we strive to do. Our church has been blessed to assume the responsibilities of faith in/to a world that shows minimal spiritual returns.

As we provided ministry through the challenging times of the past, be encouraged and prepared for the challenging times to come. Remember that Easter means resurrection for Jesus and resurrection for ourselves. Pentecost provides the scenarios that grow faith!


Treasurer's Report

As of the end of March, net income (income less expenses) was \$27,723. Year-to-date income was \$50,865 and year-to-date expenses were \$23,142. We continue to be able to grow our net income as our weekly offerings have outpaced expectations and repair and maintenance expenses have been low.
