## The Pastor's Space

Grace, Peace and Love:

How quick the days, weeks, months, and year are passing. We entered the Easter Season some eight weeks ago. Remember, as it took Jesus just three days to be resurrected; for humanity it takes a lifetime to resurrect the Spirit's new you. Since entering the liturgical year on Advent, we have progressed into Pentecost, the longest season of the church year. What is the significance of Pentecost's length and meaning?

Pentecost is the season in which humanity has evolved in the Christian journey to salvation. It is the season in which humanity will demonstrate its worthiness for eternity. It is the season in which Jesus will return to consummate and finalize the promise of grace. Its length portrays the long period given for faith's appeal to be realized. It is the last and final season that prepares the faithful for the promised life ahead, the blessings of salvation and eternal blessedness.

Pentecost season's importance is to not only guide believers along life's journey given to travel, but to also grow in spirit from the experiences that come our way in life. Those experiences help to shape and mold a spirit that is pleasing in the sight of divine presence. When we remember that God is spirit, we realize that the only way to please God is in spirit. The Pentecost Season reveals the spirit's capacity to change a person's direction from selfish unawareness to selfless awareness.

Here in this Pentecost Season, may its spirit help us to relinquish the things that hold us back from full acceptance of its lead in through the changes and chances of life.

The intent of our faithful assembly, worship, and fellowship gatherings are meant to reinforce the spirit and faith bonds that exist to strengthen the ministry we share together. Prepare yourself for the Pentecost examples that will be encountered in the long season ahead. Prepare yourself for the people and events that arise, designed to bring the faithful closer to divine presence. Our work as God's church in the world, Pentecost presence in the world, building faith in the world, is that important!

As of the end of April, net income (income less expenses) was \$32,161. Year-to-date income was \$61,473 and year-to-date expenses were \$29,312. We continue to be able to grow our net income as repair and maintenance expenses have been low.
