As of the end of August, net income (income less expenses) was \$43,913. Year-to-date income was \$107,546 and year-to-date expenses were \$63,633. Our financial results continue to be better than expected versus the budget.

Next month you will see a significant drop in net income as our annual property insurance premium of \$20,045 becomes due. This large expense was anticipated and our favorable financial position enables us to absorb this hefty cost.
