Grace, Peace and Love:

November places us in a new month, a new liturgical season, an open and renewed time to see God in different ways. As we prepare to enter the new liturgical season of Advent, we are provided two additional weeks to close the long season of Pentecost, preparing the spirit of the faithful to enter into "Advent", the new Season of renewal. Those closing two weeks begin with the celebration of the **Reformation and All Saint's**. These two celebratory weeks ask the believer to acknowledge the spiritual growth received, the experiences that led to that growth by giving thanks to the God of Creation for the experiences that helped shape our personal growth.

**Reformation** - reinforces and reminds the church of the important work of Martin Luther. Luther's attempt to bring truth/meaning to what scripture teaches and conveys as we

live out our faith. Luther tells us: "that our faith is justified by the grace that God provides His faithful." That grace frees the spirit to live and pursue the will of God in life. Luther's effort to reform the Catholic Church has given Christendom truth about religious authority, how to achieve salvation that brought about the "Protestant Reformation".

We remember with thanksgiving those blessed fellow believers who died in the faith and are now at rest even as we wait with them for the last day and the resurrection of the body to eternal life with Christ.

These celebrations close the season of spirit and place the faithful in the season of preparation for a new opportunity to know and see God in the many ways he can be seen and known. My advice to you "members of Faith Lutheran Church" is to prepare yourself and be open to the many new spiritual discoveries that will come your way in this new Season. Be open to the direction that the spirit leads, new discoveries that strengthen faith for the journey that we, the faithful, all must walk together.

Our summer-time leisure experiences are now being changed to fall/autumn preparation for personal renewal. Be renewed and know that God's will is done through the faithful like you and me.

#### The Parable of the Mustard Seed

Matthew 13:31-32 "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches." –

The parable of the Mustard Seed emphasizes the power of small acts of stewardship that can have a significant

**impact**. The mustard seed, though tiny, grows into a large tree that provides shelter and sustenance for birds. This parable teaches us that even the **smallest acts of stewardship** can bring about positive change and blessings

for others.

It encourages us to recognize the value of our actions, no matter how seemingly insignificant, in the grand scheme of stewardship.
