With the Liturgical Season of Pentecost 2024 behind us, the new Liturgical Season of Advent enters into our conscious spiritual presence and awareness. Advent means “THE COMING.” Advent reminds us of Jesus’ promise to someday return in what scripture portrays as: “The end of the age for humanity”. It will be a time of closure and new beginnings, a time of finality that ushers in a new heaven and a new earth. A time that separates wheat from chaff as the parable exclaims. It is a time that consummates the separation of believers and non-believers by faith.
